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Moreover, a recent outside review of the two main Department of Energy Ioan programs to clean-energy companies found that the government's potential losses, while still hefty, have lessened over time, to \$2.68 billion. (A123 received substantial public aid, but the company says it has fulfilled the terms of those obligations so far.)

But the Solyndra case and other failures are likely to heighten scrutiny of Obama's proposals, as they provide more ammunition to critics who have questioned the wisdom of Washington funding specific companies with taxpayer dollars.
