

Delusional woman issues list of bare minimum expectations to her Tinder date including a strict minimum salary

● A woman, thought to be US-based, has a list of 18 qualities she wants in a man

● A woman has sparked debate after a list she sent to a potential [Tinder](#) date was shared online.

The anonymous woman, thought to be US-based, put 18 qualities on her list, which she titled 'bare minimum for husband'.

After being sent the list, her potential date took to [Reddit](#) to post it in the Tinder forum. He titled his post 'She sent me a list of her requirements. One of them includes a salary of \$300k+', and shared the list in his post.

The poster revealed he asked his Tinder match: 'I just read your profile. Tell me about the checklist.'

She replied: 'Hahah do you want to see it?'

He said he did, and she replied that it is 'quite the list' before sending it to him.

The first requirement listed was 'loves me deeply and puts me first', followed by 'financially successful (300k+ salary)', 'generous and spoils me ', and 'sophisticated and enjoys luxury'.

She then moved onto personal qualities she is looking for in a man, which include him being emotionally intelligent and confident; chivalrous and protective; ambitious and disciplined, and family-oriented and well-connected.

Bare Minimum for Husband

1. Loves me deeply and puts me first
2. Financially successful (300k+ salary)
3. Generous and spoils me
4. Sophisticated and enjoys luxury
5. Emotionally intelligent and confident
6. Chivalrous and protective
7. Ambitious and disciplined
8. Family-oriented and well-connected
9. Fit, attractive, and well-groomed
10. Takes control and makes plans
11. Keeps his word and values trust

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The list, shared in Reddit's Tinder forum, listed a range of qualities from a large salary to being fit and well groomed

In addition, she revealed she is looking for someone fit, attractive, and well-groomed, who takes control and makes plans, keeps his word and values trust, supports her goals and lifestyle, and is fun, outgoing, and socially respected.

If that weren't enough, she added five more 'bare minimum' qualities she is looking for in a man.

She wants someone who prefers privacy over social media validation, loves traveling and fine dining, is sexually disciplined and loyal, handles pregnancy prevention (as she doesn't want to take the pill) and makes life easier - by hiring a maid and chef, for example.

People took to the post to share their opinions - with many feeling that the woman was being unreasonable in her demands.

One wrote: 'I know someone with such demands and is still single after a decade.'

A second said: 'That's the craziest list I've seen on here ever. I really hope that's more of a joke than her actual expectations.'

A third poster wrote: 'As a woman, that's INSANE to have a list written out and sending it on social dating apps. The list alone is insane.'

Another added: 'Yeah maybe if she's a supermodel and has a house in the Hamptons. People these days are delusional. At some point she'll realize her standards are absolutely ridiculous and she'll become more realistic.'

Some respondents said the list suggested the woman was looking for someone based on what they have, as opposed to who they are.

One said: 'She's looking entirely for what she can GET from someone. There was very little in there about character, values, interests, or personality type.'

That's a girl that wants you for what you have rather than who you are,' another said. 'Men like this are either taken by precious beautiful women and they both most likely

started with nothing. And If they re single, They have so many options it's hard to keep them loyal.

'Please tell her to keep dreaming and move on. Not matter how good she looks she is totally delusional.'

'She's looking entirely for what she can GET from someone,' one said. 'There was very little in there about character, values, interests, or personality type.'

Meanwhile, others noted that it would be almost impossible to meet someone who is such a high earner and family-orientated.

One commentator said: 'Honestly, makes \$300k salary [and] is family-oriented? The Unicorn.'

Another agreed, writing: 'Anyone who makes that salary is likely a workaholic, and/or works on the rigs and is away from home for half the month.'

'As a guy who is ambitious and have a lot of money, ain't no way I can put her or family first. Work is all consuming. Unless she's lookin for a guy over 50 or close to retirement,' another wrote.

And a third discussed their own experience, revealing: 'This made me chuckle, my dad worked real hard and earns more than that annually but when I was a kid he was never present nor very pleasant to be around. Didn't have a good relationship with him until I was an adult.'

And others suggested that someone with all those qualities would not be using a dating app.

'Anyone that fits each of those probably isn't on tinder,' one said.

Another Reddit user added: 'Guys who makes that much won't be that free to put her first.'
